RE: DCRB Filing No. 1704 Workers Compensation F-Classification and USLHW Rating Value Filing **Proposed Effective December 1, 2017**

Dear Commissioner Navarro:

On behalf of the members of the Delaware Compensation Rating Bureau, Inc. (DCRB), I am filing workers compensation rating values for employment classifications subject to the United States Longshore and Harbor Workers (USL&HW) Compensation Act, known as F-Classifications. This filing proposes a reduction of 0.4% in collectible premium and a reduction of 3.7% in the collectible loss cost level, to be effective 12:01 a.m., December 1, 2017 with respect to new and renewal policies.

Those changes produce an increase of 0.2% in overall manual rate level and a decrease of 3.0% in overall manual loss cost level. In addition, this filing proposes to revise the USL&HW Compensation Coverage Percentage, the Expense Constant and the Tax Multiplier. Full details are contained in the Actuarial Memorandum and supporting exhibits.

Total direct written premium for workers compensation in Delaware, including State Act classes and USL&HW Act classes, was \$206,232,000 in Calendar Year 2016. USL&HW earned premium that was reported for Calendar Year 2016 in our 2016 Financial Data Calls was less than \$1 million. This shows that the volume of USL&HW business is fairly small in comparison to the total Delaware workers compensation market.
